The facts on Remuneration for Medication Reviews

Introduction

Remunerated medication review services include those provided to:

- Residents of Aged Care Facilities (ACF) (permanent residents of Australian Government funded facilities, including those in flexible care arrangements (transitional care facilities) who are not eligible for a Home Medicines Review (HMR) – a Residential Medication Management Review (RMMR)
- Clients of the Department of Veterans' Affairs (DVA) who are living in the community
- Consumers living at home – Home Medicines Review (HMR) (previously known as a Domiciliary Medicines Management Review (DMMR)).

Accreditation and Approval

For Commonwealth remuneration to apply, the pharmacist who conducts the medication review must be accredited by an approved body, such as the AACP. Owners of community pharmacies approved to supply pharmaceutical benefits under Section 90 of the *National Health Act 1953* do not need to be accredited to be an approved 6CPA (6th Community Pharmacy Agreement) Program Provider, but must have access to an accredited pharmacist, register as a *6CPA Program Service Provider*, have read the program specific guidelines specific to the individual program and agree to the terms and conditions.

Independent accredited pharmacists are also eligible to become approved 6CPA MMR (both HMR and RMMR) service providers. In order to be eligible, independent accredited pharmacists need to also complete the online registration form, read the program specific guidelines and agree to the terms and conditions.

Agreement

The agreement with an Aged Care Facility to provide medication reviews is separate to any agreement for the provision of dispensing or other pharmacy services.

To become an approved RMMR service provider, an RMMR Service Agreement must be in place. An RMMR Service Agreement is an agreement between a prospective RMMR service provider and an ACF or multi purpose service (MPS), for the provision of RMMR services.

All Australian Government funded residential ACFs or MPS are eligible to obtain access to RMMR services including those in flexible care arrangements (transitional care facilities). The approved RMMR service provider is responsible for ensuring that the agreement entered into with the ACF or MPS constitutes a valid RMMR Service Agreement. The approved RMMR service provider ensures RMMR services are conducted by an Accredited Pharmacist who is able to respond appropriately to requests from the resident's GP, ACF

or MPS, and that such services adhere to recognised professional standards. Copies of agreements are available from the 6CPA website at: <http://6cpa.com.au/medication-management-programmes/residential-medication-management-review/>

Remuneration

- Residential Aged Care Facilities:** Providers (i.e. those who hold the agreement with the facility) are remunerated directly from funds via the 6CPA held by the Pharmacy Guild of Australia. All claims for payment are submitted online via the 6CPA registration and claiming portal at <http://6cpa.com.au/portal-access/>
 Accredited pharmacists may hold this agreement or be employed by or contracted to the pharmacist, pharmacy or business which holds the agreement.
- HMR:** The approved HMR Service Provider nominated by the consumer to receive the GP referral receives the remuneration. GPs can provide an HMR referral directly to an accredited pharmacist who has been approved as a 6CPA HMR service provider, as well as to a patient’s usual community pharmacy. Those accredited pharmacists who are not community pharmacy owners have agreements or employee contracts covering their remuneration for HMRs referred to section 90 pharmacies.
